"The Proof Is In the Pudding"

Have you ever heard or made this statement? If so, do you know where it comes from or what it means? The original form of the saying, "The proof of the pudding is in the tasting" is thought to date back to the 14th century. To understand the meaning of it, you might need to know that the word "proof" at that time would have referred to the testing of something. Therefore the meaning of the saying, both then and now, is that, in order to know the true nature or quality of something, you cannot just take a casual look at it. You must see it in action. By the way, "pudding," in its historical context, does not refer to a creamy, tasty dessert dish but rather a type of sausage made up of an assortment of minced meats, along with other ingredients and seasonings, stuffed into a casing of sheep or pig intestine. This savory concoction could be, and often was, toxic if not prepared properly, which adds an important layer of understanding to the saying, "the proof of the pudding is in the tasting."

May I draw a spiritual parallel to this interesting, if unimportant anecdote? Consider these words of Jesus: "For a good tree does not bear bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit. For men do not gather figs from thorns, nor do they gather grapes from a bramble bush. A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil" (Luke 6:43-45). Do you see the connection? Jesus is teaching us that the true test of a person's faithfulness is not what they claim to be or say, but rather, the fruit that their life bears. To put it in terms of the saying, "The proof of a righteous life is in the living." It can be very easy for us to pretend to be spiritually-minded and God-fearing. We can even convince ourselves that we are living faithful lives, but what does our fruit say? Are we producing the fruits of the Spirit that Paul mentions in Galatians 5:22-23? Do our words, actions, and attitudes reflect the fact that we have been transformed and are truly living for Christ? May we be committed to lives that constantly bear fruit to the glory of God.


