

# Outreach—Pat Cowden

We did have a great OHM meeting on the 23<sup>rd</sup> with Team 4 including four visitors. I want to thank all who have supported this ministry so far and encourage you to get involved. In addition, we had another successful Monday Night for the Master on Monday the 25<sup>th</sup>. Several of our members were busy writing cards of encouragement and we sent out five teams of two into our community inviting folks who have recently moved into the area to our Friends Day today.

Sometimes our friends and neighbors might go years without a special effort to interest them in spiritual matters. This ought not to be so. Dr. North recalls this event in the book, *Evangelizing Your Community*:

Recently a man and woman came to a small gathering after services. The husband had attended for years but had never obeyed the gospel. As people around the room were introducing themselves, the man gave his name and said, "But I am not a member of the church."

A woman seated near him said, "Why not?"

He replied, "Well, I don't know. I just never decided to."

To which the woman replied, "Well, you ought to." He was baptized the next week. Although this is pretty strong and may be too bold for some situations, we more often err by not being bold enough, doing nothing.

Additional advice he gives in the book:

- -Encourage families already close to the person to step up their contact with them at social or athletic events.
- -Decide who is the best positioned and prepared to take a direct approach to invite the person for a study.
- -Try to get the person into a small group Bible study.
- -If not already attending a Bible class, encourage them to do so.
- -Connect them with people their own age and with similar interests: work or hobbies.
- (OHM teams came from this recommendation.)

Remember, I love you in the Lord and want to go to heaven with you.


