Laying the Groundwork for Growth

But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love. For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

2 Peter 1:5-8

As Peter begins to discuss the spiritual growth that is essential to a fruitful Christian life, he points back to some foundational groundwork that has already been laid in the opening words of this letter. The phrase, "But also for this very reason" tells us to look back to find the reason and motivation for our diligent striving for growth. As we do so, we quickly find three things that Peter points to as the groundwork for our spiritual growth:

Faith (vs. 1). As Peter begins his listing of qualities to add to our lives, we notice that faith is already present. In verse one, he explains that we have obtained that "like precious faith" as we have come to know God and His Son and have been convinced of their righteousness. Faith is fundamental to our relationship with God and, without it, we cannot please Him (Heb. 11:6).

Knowledge (vs. 3). God, through His power, has given us everything that we need to know in order to live a good and godly life and to establish and maintain a faithful relationship with Him. God's inspired word, when properly studied and applied to our lives, is able to make us complete as faithful servants of God (2 Tim. 3:16-17).

Promises of God (vs. 4). As we spend time in the word of God, we are constantly reminded of the many "great and precious promises" that God has made to us. These promises give us confidence, hope, joy, and peace as they assure us of God's love, mercy, and grace, allowing us, through the atoning sacrifice of Christ, to have a relationship with God and freedom from sin.

Over the next several weeks, we will examine the attributes that we are to add to our faith as we diligently strive for spiritual growth. But, it is important to recognize our beginning point. The addition of those important spiritual qualities requires a proper foundation on which to build. That foundation, as Peter points out, is made up of faith, knowledge, and the promises of God. How is your spiritual foundation? Is it complete, strong, and ready for building upon?

The Light Overcame the Darkness—Nathan Adams

I love the "I am" statements by Jesus Christ in the book of John. In John 9:5, Jesus stated, "I am the Light of the world." As proof of that statement, Jesus opened the dark eyes of a blind man so that he could see light for the first time in his life (vs. 6-7). In John's introduction to Jesus he stated, "In Him was life, and the life was the Light of men. The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it" (1:4-5). repeatedly used the stark contrast between light and darkness in his writing. He did this to show the extreme difference between the beautiful righteousness of Jesus Christ and the horrible sinfulness of man.

God made a similar powerful contrast at the cross of Jesus. After Jesus suffered on the cross for three hours an amazing event took place.

Matthew. Mark. and Luke all record that at 12:00 on that Friday it became dark. Luke tells us that the sun was "obscured" (23:45). This is a word that literally means the sun "failed" or "ceased" to shine. I have seen darkened days due to thick cloud cover, but there was still light pushing through the clouds that demonstrated that the sun was still shining. I have witnessed solar eclipses, yet the darkest parts of those events were only for a few moments, not three long hours. Can you imagine the sun ceasing to shine in the middle of the day for three hours? For the most evil event the world has ever witnessed, God removed the light of day and made the world dark for three hours. This darkness was a physical representation of the hearts of men that would seek to destroy the Light of the world upon a cruel cross.

As we think of this. I believe there is something about this event we forget. Most of us can readily state what happened at the death of Jesus. The earth shook and the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. What many forget is the light! Luke recorded for us that it was dark till the ninth hour at which time the veil of the temple was torn (23:44-45). Matthew tells that the veil was torn after Jesus yielded up His spirit in death (27:50 -51). When we consider the harmony of the texts, it indicates that when Jesus breathed His last breath the light of the sun burst back upon the scene. Imagine how bright it was after 3 hours of darkness. When Jesus died - the light overcame the darkness. Jesus was, is, and forever will be the Light of the world!

Weekly Bible Reading

Reading for September 4-10: 1 Thessalonians 1-5

Among the many issues that Paul touches on in this first letter to the Thessalonians is the truth concerning Christ's second coming. He presents the Lord's return, not as a day to be dreaded and feared, but rather, as a day to be anticipated and a promise to take comfort in. It occurs to me that we still need that reassurance today. For the Christian, the Lord's return should be a longed for and prayed for event. As you read and study this week, consider these thoughts:

- Why do you think that we often fear or dread the return of Christ?
- Considering the certainty of Christ's return, what are some lessons that we learn from this letter about how our lives should be lived?

⁸ But let us who are of the day be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and as a helmet the hope of salvation. ⁹ For God did not appoint us to wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ.
