Honesty. In the society we live in, honesty sometimes seems like a lost way of doing things. The world around us lives by the rule of "whatever it takes to get the job done." Should honesty be a mere suggestion? Does it matter whether or not we follow through with the things we say we will? Does it matter if what we tell others is truthful? What about the "little white lies" in order to portray ourselves in a more positive light or to not hurt someone's feelings?

As a rule, if Christians are unsure of how we should act in certain life situations, our go to should be the word of God. What does the Bible say about honesty? Is a little bit of dishonesty for the "right reasons" okay?

If we are to have a heart which is seeking after God, we should consider what the heart of God is like. Has God ever given us a pattern where He approved of a lie or has He Himself lied?

Hebrews 6:18 tells us that God is unable to lie. The reason God is unable to lie is, it is against His very nature. Not only is God not willing to lie, He is unable to lie because it would go against the very nature of His being.

So, what about us? We know that we cannot be perfect and be exactly like God. But what is our benchmark? Has God provided any sort of standard for us when it comes to honesty? Yes!

Lying was against the Levitical law, according to Leviticus 19:11, "You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; you shall not lie to one another." We can see the hatred God has for lying even earlier than this in the Garden of Eden which He created for the pinnacle of His creation,

mankind. The serpent deceived Adam and Eve, and God handed down a severe punishment.

Consider what is said in Proverbs, 12:22 about lying "Lying lips are an abomination to the LORD, but those who act faithfully are His delight." This verse pulls no punches when it comes to describing how God feels about lying, He hates it!

In the New Testament Paul says that we should not lie to one another since that was the type of activity the "old man" would be a part of. Consider Colossians 3:9, "Do not lie to each other, since you have taken off your old self with its practices"

Christians are to be a people of honesty. The Lord delights in honesty and detests dishonesty. Let each of us resist the temptation to be dishonest, regardless of what consequence may come of it.

The Shepherd—Nathan Adams

David tells us in the beloved Psalm 23 that "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want." David found great strength and comfort in his shepherd because that shepherd provided everything that David needed to live healthy. I have seen modern day Masai shepherds in Tanzania and they knew every one of their goats. Three shepherds could be at the same watering hole with 200 goats each and they would leave with every one of them. A shepherd knows his sheep because of the time that he spends getting to know them. That time spent not only allows the shepherd to know his sheep, but also for his sheep to know him. It is this knowledge that enables a shepherd to take care of his sheep's needs. David describes this by saving, "I shall not want."

The psalm continues with David speaking of the shepherd's provision for his sheep's needs. They receive all the food they need and water that they can drink. This provision restores their strength and vitality.

The shepherd also guides the sheep in the best paths that lead to those green pastures and still waters. He does not lead them down paths that end in barren and dry land.

There are even times when a shepherd must take his sheep through those places that are dark, difficult, and scary. The sheep will follow him because their relationship with him has taught them to trust his protection found in his rod and staff. The efforts of the shepherd allow the sheep to know goodness and lovingkindness all their days as they dwell in his flock.

David understood what it meant to be a shepherd and made this comparison to the Lord in his life. He was nourished, led, loved, comforted, and protected by the Lord. It was his faith in his shepherd that led him onto the battlefield with Goliath and through the deep dark valley of Absalom's rebellion. David strayed many times, yet the Shepherd left the 100 to find him and bring him back to the flock (Luke 15:1-7).

In John 10, Jesus said that He is the good shepherd. He also speaks of the trust that His sheep have in Him because they know Him. His sheep want to and will only follow Him because of who He is. They are not forced to follow, they want to follow because He loves, comforts, nourishes, and protects them. He cares so much for His sheep that He is willing to die for them.

The imagery of the shepherd is found throughout the Bible. It is an image of relationship, guidance, and care. God chose this same metaphor for those that would be elders in the church to emulate. The good shepherd Jesus showed us these attributes in His and is now the Chief Shepherd (1 Peter 5:4). May we follow Him saying as David that the Lord is my shepherd. I will trust in His care and protection all the days of my life. If we do, we will know His loving care, abundant nourishment, unfailing protection in our lives.


