- **Renewal.** God, through Christ, is able to create in us renewal—renewal from sin, discouragement, complacency, and a troubled spirit (Isaiah 40:31).

Lamications—Andrew Lamica

If I took a poll of the congregation and asked how many enjoy being chastened, it is very unlikely the majority would say they find it enjoyable. As a rule, we generally do not look forward to discipline or punishment, even in the situations where we know we deserve it.

I want you to imagine for a minute what it might be like if we were never chastened. What if when we made mistakes and did the things that were bad for us, there was no consequence to follow those actions? At first, that might sound like a good deal for us. The idea of avoiding consequences for bad decisions sounds very palatable. The fact is, we need consequences. Consequences are what help us to see and understand the negative effects of our mistakes and bad

decisions. If it wasn't for being chastened and or corrected when we make our bad decisions, we might continue in a detrimental pattern for long periods of time. It is through being corrected that we can find our focus.

The writer of Proverbs reminds us that one of the ways God shows His love for us is by chastening us when we go astray. Consider Proverbs 3:11, "My son, do not despise the chastening of the Lord, nor detest His correction; For whom the Lord loves He corrects. Just as a father the son in whom He delights."

As parents we understand that the reason we correct our children is we want to keep them from getting themselves into bad decisions. When we see they are heading down a dangerous road, because we love them, we correct them. The same is true with God! God loves us, therefore, He wants what is best for us. God uses His word to correct the things in our lives that need correcting.

What is your attitude toward correction? If our attitude is right, chastening/correction is a beautiful thing. If we will take the correction of the Lord and of people with wisdom we can avoid future heartbreaks in our lives. Rejection of correction often times shows a lack of spiritual maturity.

What a blessing it is to accept correction from our Lord who loves us and wants the best for us. How much better might your life on earth be if we looked at the chastisement of our Lord as a blessing.

Paul's Farewell—Nathan Adams

My family and I are saddened that today is our last Sunday as members of the family at Chase Park. We have been truly blessed to be a part of this loving and kind congregation. So many of you have loved and encouraged us. We are thankful to God for you and will carry your love in our hearts always. At these times, I am often at a loss for adequate words. However, I think that the apostle Paul had the right words on such occasions of leaving brethren that he loved. He understood like David (2 Samuel 12:23), that the length of any separation for children of God is determined by our faithfulness. Therefore. Paul's final words were always to encourage faithfulness. I believe that is a worthy model.

As Paul was traveling to Jerusalem before his imprisonment, in Acts 20, he stopped to say farewell to the elders of Ephesus. Paul had worked with this congregation for three years. There was clearly a strong bond between Paul and this church. In his farewell, he admonished these

elders to guard the flock (v. 28), work hard, and help the weak remembering the words of Jesus, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." (v. 35) We often speak of those words in reference to our contribution: Paul used them in reference to our giving of service to others. All that they needed to do could be found in only one place and Paul ultimately pointed them in that direction by saying, "And now I commend you to God and to the word of His grace, which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance all those among who sanctified" (v. 32).

Some years later in Paul's farewell to his precious Timothy in 2 Timothy 4, he told Timothy to "Preach the word..." (v. 2) Paul always encouraged people to engage in God's word through both the strengthening of their own life through study and the lives of others by teaching. Paul concludes by stating that he had fought the good fight, finished the course, and kept the faith (v. 7). He was not bragging, he was

encouraging Timothy to remember the power of faithfulness during our times of separation. It was his faithfulness that would enable him to receive the crown of righteousness given by Jesus (v. 8). Paul is not just talking about his reward, he goes on to say that the crown of righteousness will be given to "all those who have loved His appearing." Paul is telling Timothy, through faith we can be in the same place and with the same reward one day.

I had an elder in North Carolina who would never say goodbye to another Christian, he said that there are no goodbyes between faithful Christians—only "See you later." There is much truth in the reality that the longest faithful Christians can be truly separated is for this short vapor of life. I pray that each of you will devote yourself fully to God's word and live faithfully to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Then we can say with full assurance, "See you later."
