

## It is the spirit...

Recently, Kerry Richardson brought us an excellent message from John 6 in response to the Lord's question posed to His followers. Those who were followers of Christ had reached a decision point. Were they truly committed to Jesus as the Christ, the Messiah? As we see from the context of John 6, many of His disciples chose to turn away. Fortunately for the Way, the twelve disciples remained faithful.

Our Lord made this statement as He reasoned with the disciples before they departed, **"It is the spirit that giveth life; the flesh profiteth nothing; the words that I have spoken unto you are spirit, and are life"** (John 6:63). As there was for this gathering of disciples, there is a choice placed before each of us. It is basically a choice between the things of this physical world and those things which are of the spiritual world; the flesh or the spiritual.

From long ago, we have the noble words of Joshua as he addressed God's people: *"...choose you this day whom ye will serve; whether the gods which your fathers served that were beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land ye dwell: but as for me and my house, we will serve Jehovah."* (Joshua 24:15) Again, their choice was of the flesh (kingdoms and gods of this world) or the spiritual (Jehovah God Almighty).

Satan's temptations thrown at us can only be "of this world," fleshly. Consider 1 John 2:16, *"For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the vain glory of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world."* Compare the ways Satan tried and failed in his temptations of Jesus to turn his faithful obedience to God's will.

In John 6:63 Christ states the reality of our choice clearly. It is not that there are not things of this world that can be obtained, nor that they do not have some value in this life. The emphasis is upon "life." There is, at the heart of Holy Scripture, the realization of life after physical death, an eternal realm. Our eternal destiny depends upon our faithful obedience to God's will. As we face Satan's temptations, may we always recall the Lord's words, **"It is the spirit that giveth life, the flesh profiteth nothing."**


Take heart in our Lord's statement in John 10:10, **"I came that they may have life, and may have it abundantly."**

## Lamications—*Andrew Lamica*

If you have lived any length of time, chances are you have experienced a life changing event on one level or another. Maybe it was the birth of a child or the loss of a job. Perhaps it was the death of someone you hold dear. For all of us, at one point or another something happens that completely changes the course of our life.

A life changing event happened in the lives of Simon and Andrew while they were fishing on the Sea of Galilee for they were fisherman. Jesus was walking beside that sea when He called out to them saying "*Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men*" (Matthew 4:19). What happened next is truly remarkable. The Bible records that the men immediately left their nets to follow Jesus.

This is a truly life changing event! While it may not seem like too big of

a deal to walk away from fishing nets, once we realize what it meant, we see the true magnitude of the decision! When Simon and Andrew left their nets to follow Jesus, they were leaving their lives behind! Their nets equaled their livelihood. It was how they supported themselves. They were willing to make such a decision because they had found something greater!

After Jesus called these men, He continued and found two brothers, James the son of Zebedee and John his brother in the boat with their father. Jesus called them to follow Him as well! The Bible records that they immediately left their nets, their boat, and their father to follow Him. Another life changing experience! Not only did James and John leave their occupation but they left their families to follow Jesus!

Most of the time when we think of

a life changing experience, we think of it as a negative. These life changing experiences recorded in Matthew 4 were for the better! These men made the decision to follow the Son of God and share His love with the world around them!

If you are a Christian, you too have had a life changing experience. You died to sin (Romans 6:1-4), to live for Christ! You made the decision to no longer live for self but to live for Christ!

If you are not a Christian, you still have the opportunity to experience a truly life changing event by being baptized into the family of God. There is no greater life changing experience that one can have!

## Make A List Of Souls You Would Like To See Taught The Gospel

Making a "list" may not seem important, but it is as we look to increase our opportunities to share the Gospel! It utilizes a very helpful technique used by people successful in all walks of life (i.e., having a "things to do" list). For us, it helps to focus our attention upon those we hope to reach for the Lord, and not neglect them.

In making up this list, we should observe the following suggestions: First, **START WITH THOSE WHO ARE CLOSE TO YOU AND WORK OUTWARDLY: FAMILY, FRIENDS, CO-WORKERS, NEIGHBORS, RELATIVES OF FELLOW CHURCH MEMBERS, REGULAR VISITORS TO THE SERVICES OF THE CHURCH, AND CASUAL AQUAINTANCES (MAILMAN, STORE CLERK, ETC.).** We would need to limit this list to five or eight souls (a list

with too many and you will not be able to focus your efforts effectively). Give priority to those who are the "unchurched." That is, those who are not active members of any denomination or particular religion. Those who are active members of a denomination or religion are often very satisfied with their human traditions and are not as receptive to the pure and simple gospel of Christ. Husbands and wives should probably have one list (as the suggestions to follow will require their joint cooperation).

Second, **KEEP THIS LIST WHERE YOU WILL SEE IT DAILY.** This will help you to be constantly reminded of these people and thereby more likely to do the things mentioned next.

Third, **PRAY FOR THESE SOULS ON YOUR LIST DAILY.** Why pray? First, that God will

work together with you to give you "opportunities" to do good for them (1Cor. 3:5-7; Col. 4:3); to give you the "wisdom" to make the most of those opportunities (Col.4:4-6); to give you "boldness" to say what needs to be said (Eph. 6:18-20). Also, that those on your list will have the opportunity to hear the truth and have honest hearts to be open and receptive to the truth.

Remember, it is GOD who gives the increase when it comes to evangelism. We are but servants whom God can use in His providential workings. So though we may work as though it all depends upon us, let us pray as though it all depends upon God!

*A question about our confidence in the promises of God*

This question is asked of Martha, the friend of Jesus, on the occasion of the death of her brother, Lazarus. At a time when her thoughts are dominated by death and she is overwhelmed with sorrow, Jesus talks to her about life and resurrection and an existence without death. It is about these subjects that He asks the question, “Do you believe this?” It is often during the most trying times of our lives, those times when we need the assurance of God’s presence and care the most, that we face the greatest struggle in believing and trusting in God’s promises.
