A REQUEST FROM YOUR ELDERS

Can you imagine a shepherd watching over 400 sheep and being concerned about one of them just as much as the other 399? As your elders, we have a great responsibility of feeding the flock (Acts 20:28) and for every member of the congregation to grow in his or her faith. As we read the New Testament, many who were once faithful Christians, left the Lord and His church. As elders, our number one desire is for every member at Chase Park to go to heaven. But in desiring that to happen, every member needs to realize his or her personal responsibility as well to live a faithful Christian life making it a great joy for the elders watching over their soul. Notice this verse, "Obey those who rule over you and be submissive, for they watch out for your souls, as those who must give account. Let them do so with joy and not with grief, for that would be unprofitable for you" (Heb. 13:17).

Satan uses opportunities when we are discouraged or when we have sinned to get us to forsake the assembly. But that is the time when, more than any other, we need to have that fellowship with one another and the strength of God who loves us.

As your elders, we want to encourage every member to sign an attendance card at all three services. Again, with around 400 in attendance, it is sometimes difficult to see and speak to everyone and even to know who is present or who is not present. If you haven't been filling out attendance cards, we are asking you to do so. We are concerned about every member—often we can determine by attendance or nonattendance, that there may be sickness, personal problems, or family difficulties or struggles and we want to do what we can to help. The writer of Hebrews encourages each of us by stating these words, "Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as ye see the day approaching" (Heb. 10:25) and by attending it "stirs up love and good works" (v.24). By filling out attendance cards, you are showing how glad you are to be among those in the House of the Lord (Psa. 122:1) and to be counted among other believers. As your overseers, one of the first things we do on Sundays in our meetings is to go over the attendance cards and see those who were absent from our assemblies—checking and wanting to find out if everything is okay with those who were not present in worship or attended Bible classes. So, we need your cooperation and help in marking your attendance. Thanks!

The kind of company we keep can and will have a big impact on our spiritual lives. Scripture speaks of the dangers of evil companionship in 1 Corinthians 15:33. We must always be careful that those with whom we spend the most time are not having a negative impact on our relationship with God.

On the positive side of that, if we keep good company, it can and will help our relationship with God. The relationships we have with those of a like-mind in spiritual matters will build us up and help us on our journey to heaven. One of the reasons God allowed us to have relationships with Christians is to help each other along the way.

When thinking about good examples of Christian relationships I am reminded of the relationship between the apostle Paul and Timothy. Before Timothy met Paul, he was

given a strong spiritual base at home by his mother and grandmother (2 Timothy 3:15). That base which was instilled at home, helped him be ready to form a great spiritual friendship with Paul.

Paul converted Timothy to Christianity, evidenced by Paul referring to him as his "true son in the faith" (1 Timothy 1:2; 2 Timothy 1:2). After his conversion, Timothy spent much time with Paul and built a wonderful relationship with him. Timothy was with Paul when he wrote several epistles including Romans, 2 Corinthians, Philippians, Colossians, and others! Without question Paul and Timothy spent a lot of time together, including during the first missionary journey.

What was the result of this relationship? Did Paul's relationship with Timothy bear any fruit for the kingdom? Absolutely! Because of

the great foundation laid at home and his relationship with Paul, Timothy would become a gospel preacher and minister to the church at Ephesus. Paul's positive relationship with Timothy would have lasting effects on his life.

As we consider the relationship between Paul and Timothy, it should cause us to consider the company we keep on a regular basis. Are those we spend the majority of our time with going to help us get to heaven or be a hindrance to us getting there? Do our current friendships cause us to want to be a better Christian or damage our Christianity?

May each of us be vigilant in keeping those close to us who help us want to be better tomorrow than we are today.
