Kicking Against the Goad

"It is hard for you to kick against the goads." The Lord made this statement to Saul when He appeared to him on the road to Damascus. A goad was a stick with a metal tip used to prod cattle or flocks in order to encourage them in a certain direction. The meaning of the statement was that Saul was resisting, with difficulty, the persuasive pull of the gospel. Despite all of the evidence that had been provided by Jesus of His identity and purpose, and despite all of the preaching by those who had been witnesses of His resurrection, Saul had continued to deny that Jesus was the Christ and to vehemently persecute the church. But on that fateful day, the Lord made clear that the time of resistance was over. It was time for Saul to accept Christ and his calling.

Have you ever found yourself kicking against the goad? You know, that gentle urging to make a better choice, to put away some sin, or to move closer to God and further away from the world. Maybe it was the lyrics of a song sung in worship, or a statement made in a sermon or Bible class. Maybe it was a verse that you read during your own personal Bible study. Maybe it was some combination of those things that spoke to your heart and urged you to change, but you resisted. You made excuses, justified your actions, or dismissed the feelings of guilt. But, the fact of the matter is, that it is hard to kick against the goads. It is often painful and always difficult.

So, I guess the question is: Why? Why do we continue to resist the Lord and kick against the goads? I suppose that we all have our own answers to that question, but none of them are adequate. There is no justifiable reason to resist the Lord's invitation to receive cleansing and to walk with Him. Let's decide to accept His guidance and obey His will.
