

## A Light Burning Bright

In our Teen Class we have been walking through the book of 1 Thessalonians. In chapter 1 Paul sends greetings and compliments the Thessalonians on their living faith. There are a few things that are noteworthy of the Thessalonians that we can implement within our own Christian walk. Beginning in 1:6, Paul says that Thessalonians had become “imitators of us and of the Lord”. In 1:7-8, we see the proof of their living faith as Paul accredits them being “an example to all believers” and “your faith in God has gone forth everywhere”. As you continue reading to the end of the chapter we see that the Thessalonians’ faith was living and active within their community and in their walk of life. It seems that wherever the Thessalonians went people knew who they were and viewed them as a light burning bright within the community.

The example of the Thessalonians is one we should aspire to follow. In our everyday activities, routines, and journeys we need to be recognized as lights shining in the world. Do understand that the world’s reception of us is not always cordial. As we see the Thessalonians dealing with afflictions in 1:6. Yet their example and active faith influenced the hearts and minds of many within their community and the region. Let us challenge ourselves to have an active faith that is seen and experienced by the people surrounding us throughout our community. Matthew 5:16 reads, “*In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven.*” I hope you are having a wonderful week!
