This past week our family experienced a loss that we were not expecting. When Candy and I returned from prom alternative, we soon discovered something was wrong with our family dog. He had a very swollen belly and labored breathing. A trip to the vet revealed he was experiencing congestive heart failure. After being a part of our family for five years, our dog Charlie had to be euthanized.

Charlie was a great dog. He was loved by our kids and Candy and me as well. While, I realize that losing a pet is nothing at all like losing a loved human being, I also know this, losing a pet is a good reminder of the truth found in James 4:14, "For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and vanishes away." Death is

the conclusion of all living things, nothing escapes its grasp (unless the Lord returns first).

The difference between the two losses is this, when a human passes from this life, eternity is on the line. As humans, our fate is sealed once our last breath is taken, "It is appointed a man once to die, but after this the judgment..." (Hebrews 9:27).

If you are reading this, I want you to know I want you to go to heaven! In order to get there, it is important to pay attention to how we live on earth! I want you to ask yourself a few questions:

1. Have you obeyed the gospel by being baptized for the remission of your sins? If you have not, why not? It is in baptism that we come into contact with the lifesaving blood of Christ. I, of course, did not get to hear our young ladies practicing, but I have heard wonderful reports of their efforts as well. It is a tool to help implant in the hearts of our young the word of God that will grow and be with them for a lifetime and beyond (James 1:21).

I appreciate it when other Christians encourage our young people. When he was here, Reed Swindle, encouraged us to become involved in the lives of our young ones showing them that we truly care for them. 
