Add To Your Self-Control Perseverance...

"But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love. For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."

2 Peter 1:5-8

What a challenge self-control is for us, but, oh, how incredibly important it is as we continue to grow in our faith and move forward in our spiritual lives. Our path through this world is not always easy and is often littered with temptations and trials that threaten to destroy our faith and take us away from God. As we grow in our ability to harness our thoughts, attitudes, words, and actions, especially in difficult situations, we add another vital tool to our arsenal of weapons to be used in our battles with Satan – perseverance.

Perseverance is defined as "steady persistence in a course of action, a purpose, a state, etc., especially in spite of difficulties, obstacles, or discouragement." (dictionary.com) It is that ability to not give up when faced with challenging circumstances, and it can be applied in two different ways to our spiritual lives. First, perseverance is the strength to remain faithful to God and the faith to continue to trust Him when we meet with hardship and trial and are tempted to become discouraged and quit. To persevere is to stubbornly hold to God and not allow the difficulties of life to weaken us to the point of defeat. Secondly, perseverance can be understood to be the strength and determination to choose the right path and make spiritually sound decisions when faced with temptation. Temptation is nothing more than an inward trial that is created by our own fleshly desires and used by Satan to entice us to sin. To persevere against temptation is to, with dogged determination, deny those fleshly desires and resist the enticements of the devil (consider the example of Jesus in Matthew 4).

The very fact that perseverance is a needed virtue of the Christian life tells us that life is often difficult, but we must remember that we serve a great and a merciful God who is bigger than our trials and infinitely stronger than our enemy. We are not asked to persevere on our own but with the help of the mighty hand of God to comfort, strengthen, and aid us. With these things in mind, let us strengthen our resolve to grow in perseverance.

What is our attitude toward being with our brothers and sisters in Christ? Do we look forward to coming together on the first day of the week? Are we taking advantage of the extra opportunities found outside of our worship assemblies to fellowship with those who make up the body of Christ?

As Christians, it is important that we realize the value found in Christian relationships. The relationships Christians have with one another should be like no other relationship on the planet. A Christian friendship is a friendship that is different than the friendships found in the world.

Christians are bound together through the bonds of Christ and have a relationship that will go on into eternity. If we cannot have a relationship in a temporal world, how can we expect to have a relationship throughout eternity?

The Apostle Paul felt a strong bond with the Christians who made up the young church in Thessalonica. The fact that he had to leave them earlier than he wanted to bothered him greatly and he desired to see them again. Consider what Paul writes in his letter to the Thessalonians "But since we were torn away from you, brothers for a short time, in person not in heart, we endeavored the more eagerly and with great desire to see you face to face..." (1 Thessalonians 2:17). Paul had a great love for the church in Thessalonica! He wanted to be with them in the flesh, he wanted to spend time with them as soon as he possibly could. Though Paul was away from them physically, he points out that he was never away from them emotionally, he loved them dearly.

What about us? Do we feel the same way about our brothers and sisters in the church? Do we feel the same sense of longing to see them when we are apart?

Consider a few verses of Scripture which relate to our relationships with each other:

"Iron sharpens iron, and one man sharpens another." (Proverbs 27:17)

"Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." (1 John 4:11)

"Complete my joy by being of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind." (Philippians 2:2)

In our modern world this is one of our most useful tools in outreach. The universal nature of the great commission can be better accomplished today than ever in the history of the world. What talents, interests, or passions do they have? How can those be placed within the works of Chase Park? This menu lists our work areas. Currently it shows our Involvement, Children's, and Youth/Family Ministries. This helps new and sometimes old members find areas where they can do the most good in the work of the church. If you are in charge of a ministry that you believe would benefit from being in this menu, see me for how we can include your work on the site.

While our site is more visitor friendly, our members still have all the items that they are accustomed to having on our site. These items are on the top menu bar and include the Newsline, Bulletins, Youth/Family, Missions, Calendar, and links. We have added a blog called "The Servant Blog" which will have posts from all three ministers each week.

Reading for October 16-22: Hebrews 5-9

The Hebrew letter does not only deal with the danger of backsliding into unfaithfulness. It also warns of the danger of not moving forward in our knowledge and faith. Within this warning there is the implication of a very basic yet important truth: With regard to our spiritual lives, it is impossible for us to be stationary. We will either move forward, growing closer to God as we increase in knowledge, strength, and faith; or we will move away from God. We, like the Hebrew Christians, must be determined to keep moving forward. As you read and study this week, consider:

- What are some things that we can do to help us to grow in our spiritual lives?
- What obstacles do we face as we strive to grow?

VERSES TO REMEMBER:

Hebrews 6:9-10

"But, beloved, we are confident of better things concerning you, yes, things that accompany salvation, though we speak in this manner. For God is not unjust to forget your work and labor of love which you have shown toward His name, in that you have ministered to the saints, and do minister."
