Free Indeed

Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." They answered Him, "We are Abraham's descendants, and have never been in bondage to anyone. How can You say, 'You will be made free'?"

Jesus answered them, "Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin. And a slave does not abide in the house forever, but a son abides forever. Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed.

John 8:31-36

This week, our nation will celebrate its birthday and the freedom that came with its declaration of independence from British rule in 1776. As Americans, freedom is one of our most treasured possessions and one of the things that has long made us the envy of the world. We celebrate freedom, we value freedom, and we honor the great price that was and continues to be paid to provide and maintain freedom. As Americans, may we never forget or take for granted the great blessing of freedom that we enjoy.

There are different kinds of freedom, some of which are of even greater importance than the physical freedom such as we enjoy as Americans. Unfortunately, our view of freedom can be narrowed or skewed to the point that we can perceive that we are free when, in fact, we are enslaved. We certainly see this in our world, where so many revel in the freedom to live their lives however they choose and without restraint, and fail to understand that, in so doing, they have made themselves slaves to sin and Satan. This is the point that Jesus is trying to make and that is being misunderstood by his audience in the passage above. These believing Jews, jumping immediately in their minds to a physical understanding of freedom, are offended by Jesus' suggestion that they are not free. As children of Abraham, they argued that they had never been in bondage to anyone (apparently they had forgotten about the 450 years spent in Egyptian bondage, the Babylonian captivity, and the fact that, at that very moment they were ruled by and living under the heavy hand of the Roman Empire). Jesus, however, was not referring to physical bondage but spiritual. Sin enslaves us, but Jesus offers freedom—true freedom from sin that allows us to, once and for all escape that bondage and become children of God instead. Praise God for His grace and mercy in allowing us, through the power of Jesus' atoning sacrifice, to be free indeed!


