## When An Unwavering Faith Wavers (Part 2—Elijah)

Last week, we considered doubt as an obstacle to the unwavering faith of Abraham. Even for this great man of faith, the questions and fears that doubt produced caused him to waver in His trust in the promises of God. In much the same way, doubt in God's care, His help, or His promises can chip away at our faith and cause it to waver. But doubt is not the only danger that threatens to cause an unwavering faith to waver.

Just as doubt was the shortcoming of Abraham, Elijah's faith was surely a victim of **discouragement**. In 1 Kings chapter 18, we find a defiant Elijah on Mount Carmel fearlessly facing 450 prophets of Baal. With an unwavering faith in the power and sovereignty of Jehovah, Elijah stood courageously against this army of false prophets and, with a mighty display of God's power from on high, defeated them and then executed them. The faith and courage displayed by Elijah in this event is remarkable, but in the very next chapter we see this great man of faith running for his life from the evil queen, Jezebel. Eventually, Elijah is found in a cave hiding from his enemies and lamenting his circumstances. Despite his victory on Mount Carmel and all that God has done for and through him, Elijah finds himself terribly discouraged because of his enemies. He has seemingly thrown in the towel and quit working for God. Discouragement has caused his faith to fail.

Like Elijah, we can occasionally find ourselves discouraged and wanting to give up. Discouragement can deliver a devastating blow to even the strongest faith. If you find yourself struggling with your faith because of discouragement, it might be helpful to pay attention to what God tells Elijah to do. First, you have to get out of the cave. Isolating yourself and hiding from your responsibilities is not doing you or anyone else any good. Next, God reminded Elijah that he was not alone. There were many others who could stand beside him to encourage him. Finally, he told Elijah to get busy. Nothing is as effective in overcoming discouragement as busying yourself with tasks that are encouraging, fulfilling, and purposeful. Yes, discouragement can cause even the most unwavering of faiths to waver, but with God's help, we can overcome discouragement and be strengthened in our faith once again.

This past Tuesday, we celebrated Independence Day. I hope you had a wonderful 4th and were able to spend time with those you love. Americans celebrate July 4th because on that date in 1776 the Declaration of Independence was adopted by the Continental Congress and America was born.

July 4th is often marked by family cookouts, vacations, spending time with friends. Americans use the day to reflect back on the sacrifices that have been made up to this point in order to maintain the precious freedoms that we enjoy. These freedoms have not come without a great cost. Many men and women have given their lives for the cause of liberty, and I am extremely grateful for their service. Our military men and women do a great service for those

unable to do it themselves.

As great as our freedoms as American citizens are, there is an even greater freedom to be found. Jesus Christ, because of His willingness to be the sacrificial Lamb of God bought our freedom from sin and death. Paul reminds us of such freedoms in Galatians 5:1, "For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a voke of slavery." Though we have freedom from sin and death, we have to make a choice. As Paul warned the church in Galatia, Christ bought our freedom, we ought to be careful to not be fooled into accepting the yoke of slavery to sin once again.

It is easy to be fooled as to what true freedom is. Satan is very skilled at tricking people into believing that the bondage he offers is true freedom, but it is not. While it might seem like choosing the way of the world is the path to true freedom, the end of such decision is becoming ensnared into sin.

True freedom, by willingly taking on the yoke of Christ, will lead to eternal life. "But now that you have been set free from sin and have become slaves of God, the fruit that you get leads to sanctification, and its end, eternal life."

Christians, may we never mistake Satan's illusions of "freedom" for the true freedom which is found in Jesus Christ. Jesus wants you to do nothing more than live for Him so that when our life on this earth is over we can live with Him in eternity. That is true freedom. Do you desire to live free today?

### **Increasing Opportunities To Share The Gospel**

As we continue our series from Mark Copeland, the importance of sharing the gospel of Christ with those who are lost cannot be over-emphasized. Jesus wants everyone to hear the good news of salvation (Mk. 16:15-16), and has provided the gospel as God's power to save all who believe it (Rom. 1:16-17).

But what is the most effective way to reach people today? The Institute For American Church Growth asked over 10,000 people this question: "What was responsible for your coming to Christ and this church?" Their replies were:

I had a special need - 3% I just walked in - 3%

I liked the minister - 6%

I visited there - 1%

I liked the Bible classes - 5%

I attended a gospel meeting - 0.5%

I liked the programs - 3%

A friend or relative invited me - 79%

It seems to justify churches' concern to pick their preachers and youth ministers carefully and to give special regard to the quality of their Bible classes. The obvious point of the survey is this: IF CHURCHES ARE TO GROW, IT WILL BE THROUGH THE EFFORTS OF INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS! The other congregational efforts are worthwhile, however, those individual members can reach people with whom we might otherwise never come in contact. But the fact remains: THE GREATEST POTENTIAL LIES WITH THOSE PEOPLE WHO HAVE SOME CONTACT WITH MEMBERS OF THE LOCAL CONGREGATION.

Each of us have daily contact with tons of people who need the gospel of Christ. In addition to reaching people "en masse" (via television, radio, mail), we need to utilize the contacts made through members. Unfortunately, when a special effort is being made to reach out to the masses, the tendency in most congregations is to neglect the opportunities to follow up contacts made through the members.

Two fundamental things are needed to utilize the contacts made through individual members of the congregation: First, CONCERN for the lost (Matt. 9:36-38; Rom. 9:1-3; 10:1); second, KNOWLEDGE OF HOW we can increase our opportunities to share the gospel with those with whom we frequently come into contact.

Assuming that the concern is there, we will share suggestions with accompanying "action steps" in next week's article on HOW anyone who is a Christian can increase opportunities for the gospel to be shared with their relatives, friends, neighbors, and others. These suggestions will be based upon observations of what has consistently proven fruitful in other places and are confirmed by the results of the afore mentioned survey.
