

Outreach—Pat Cowden

Last night, Lord willing, we held the 12th meeting of the OHM ministry. We will have had somewhere near 220 members of Chase Park involved and 25 or more visitors. That is a great start to an effort to reach our community. We would love for you to come as we start the next round of fellowship and devotion as we reach out to those we have contact with (Matthew 5:16).

Tomorrow, Lord willing, I will be speaking at the evening session at Camp Ney-A-Ti. My topic is "Captivity" from 2 Corinthians 10:5, which talks about the most difficult command in the Bible (in my opinion). In this verse, Paul teaches us that it is God's will that we strive to bring every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ.

Wow! Every thought. When I think about the concept of "every thought" my mind swiftly goes to Genesis 6:5 where "the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that **every intent of the thoughts** of his heart was **only evil continually**." This paints a picture of the exact opposite of what the Holy Spirit through Paul says is the aspirational goal of all Christians.

From a statistical process control standpoint, when something happens, every time or almost every time, with almost no exceptions, it is said to be "in control." To make application of this mathematical "truth" to spiritual matters related to our thoughts, we could make the following observations:

- -If "every intent of our thoughts is only evil continually", we are "in control" or controlled by something...
- -And, if we are "in control" related to evil thoughts....
- -Then, we are "in control" or controlled by something evil, i.e. the devil.

However,

- -If "every thought is brought into captivity to the obedience of Christ" we are also "in control" or controlled by something...
- -And, if we are "in control" related to good (Christ approved) thoughts...
- -Then, we are "in control" or controlled by something good, i.e. Christ.

This is not to say that we are overpowered by the devil or by Christ. That is the whole point of Genesis 6:5 and 2 Corinthians 10:5. We are totally responsible for what we allow to control our thoughts. If we want to please God, we will strive to bring our thoughts into control for Christ.

Remember, I love you in the Lord and want to go to heaven with you.
