How Reliable is our Bible Text?

There are some passages in the Bible that are sometimes questioned as reliable by Bible scholars, as to whether they belong in the Scripture text. Some of these passages include The Story of the Adulteress (John 7:53-8:11) and the ending of the book of Mark (16:9-20), among others. The reasons for their concern have to do with the reliability of the Greek manuscripts that were used in the translation of the Bible into English.

God in His wisdom has used humans to transmit His word into many different languages over time. In the time of Christ, many of the common people heard the Old Testament Scriptures from a translation of the Hebrew books into Greek, called the Septuagint. In fact, we know that Christ and the Apostles used this version in their quotes of the Old Testament.

God has also used the agency of His Providence to ensure that the Bible text that we use in our study and worship is reliable and true to His Will. For the transmission of the Hebrew Old Testament, the Jews used scribes that had very defined and restrictive rules for making copies of the text. As a result of their discipline, very few errors crept into the text. In fact, the Dead Sea Scrolls confirmed the accuracy of the Hebrew texts as greater than 95% in word-for-word.

For the New Testament the accumulated Greek manuscripts that are used for translation also represent reliable and accurate text that can give us the assurance that our New Testaments are representative of God's Word to us. We have over 5,400 Greek manuscripts as text transmissions available to translation scholars.

As Christians, we should make use of the Bible as God intended to build up our spiritual bodies and also to teach those who need to hear the Gospel message.


