## Focusing on What's Important

There are a lot of discouraging things that we see on a daily basis, and it really should not come as a surprise. Jesus told us in John 16:33 "in the world you have trouble, but take courage; I have overcome the world." We could easily become overwhelmed by the negative messages that we hear day after day.

On Sunday Reed Swindle talked in the Bible class about the amount of negative things often outweighing the positive. But we have some control over that. There are things that are negative that we can cut out of our lives, and we can add many positive things to our lives to correct that imbalance toward the negative. It requires commitment.

Too often we lose perspective on what is truly important versus what is urgent. They are not the same thing. We must recognize the difference. Lots of things that scream for our attention are really not very important at all, and end up being negative influences in our lives, either by requiring too much of our time, or by being things that draw us away from Christ.

In Ephesians 4:17-32 Paul challenged the Ephesians to stop walking like the Gentiles. We would say stop acting like the people of the world – stop living like those who don't know Christ. Our family day was a good opportunity to refocus on what is truly important, versus what is not. When our children are grown and gone from home, what will be the most important thing? Will it be that we helped them to become good at playing a sport, or will it be that we taught them to love the Lord? If we raise up good athletes who are unfaithful to Christ, we will have lost the most important thing.

Sometimes we just lose track of the time that we are spending on things that seem really important, but in view of our eternal home with God, are really not. These things can be sports as previously mentioned, or too much time at work, or our entertainment and recreation. These things must be kept in balance if we and our children are to keep the proper focus on what is truly important.

And finally, let's start adding to the positive things in our lives. We need positive messages to, and from each other, so that we begin to build one another up. Eph. 4:29 "Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only such a word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those who hear." We need to be spending regular time in personal Bible study so that we are prepared to fight off the negative influences, discouraging messages, and temptations that we face.
